Rules and Regulations (Based on Florida Rules for Admission of Animals for Exhibits

All goats must have certificates of veterinary inspection and a scrapie premise number (call 352-333-3120 or visit www.aphis.usda.gov for information). Exhibitors must have a health certificate current within 90 days for goats that originate in the State of Florida and 30 days for goats from out of state. Goats that originate in the State of Florida no longer need to be tested for tuberculosis or brucellosis. Goats originating from out of state must have been tested for tuberculosis and brucellosis within 30 days of the opening day of the fair.

Eligibility

1. The Junior and Senior open shows are separately sanctioned by ADGA. The ADGA rules shall govern.
2. Junior Show sanctioned breeds: Alpine, LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Recorded Grade, Saanen, and Toggenburg.
3. Order of Jr Show: Nigerian Dwarf, Alpine, La Mancha, Oberhasli, Nubian, Saanen, Toggenburg, and Recorded Grade.
4. Nubian Specialty Show group classes 17 and 18 held after Nubian junior class 6, and 19 – 23 after Nubian senior class 15.
5. Senior Show sanctioned breeds: Alpine, La Mancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, AOP and Recorded Grade.
6. Order of Sr Show: Nigerian Dwarf, Alpine, La Mancha, Nubian, AOP, and Recorded Grade.
7. The Official Registration certificate is required for all animals. A duplicate application for registry stamped by the ADGA office is permissible for all animals under 6 months of age. The registration certificate or stamped duplicate application must be available to show secretary before the start of the show.

Entries

1. Entries must be postmarked on or before October 1st, 2010. Postmarked later than this will be considered a late entry. An entry fee of \$8.00 per animal and the Exhibitor Release and Indemnification form MUST accompany the entry form in order to be processed. Late entries will be accepted until October 18, 2010, with a late entry fee of \$16.00 per animal. Exhibitors signing up later than October 1st, 2010 have to bring their own pens. Exhibitors sending late entries have to contact the show chairperson in order to insure available space to put up pens. Cancellations MUST be made 14 days prior to the show in order to receive a refund. Cancellations made less than 14 days before the show will not be refunded. Please contact the show chairperson for cancellations at (904) 825-6722.
2. All entry forms and fees must be sent to St. Johns County Fair, Livestock Department, 5840 State Road 207, Elkton, FL 32033.
3. Exhibitors must sign the 'Exhibitor Release and Indemnification' form, which is available on the fair website stjohnsfair.com and has to be notarized and sent with the entry.
4. There is a pen fee of \$5.00/ pen. Pens are 8 x 8 ft and can fit 5-6 jr or max 4 sr does (big size). Available pens will be determined by postmark on entry form (first come, first served basis). The St. Johns County Fair reserves the right to limit entries based on pen and space availability. Farms and families with over 15 goats will be limited if necessary. Exhibitors who have to bring their own

pens are not charged pen fee. **Optional pen clean-out is available for a fee of \$5.00**, if you are unable to clean out your pen before leaving.

5. Camping permit for electrical hook-up (RV or camper) will be available for \$30.00/night. Please indicate on entry form and include a separate check. First come, first served. Spots will run out. No tent camping.

6. Youth exhibitors entering the Open Dairy Goat Show must meet all Open Show deadlines, and must pay the regular \$ 8.00 entry fee per animal and \$5.00 pen fee.

7. In the Specialty group classes only one entry per class per exhibitor.

8. Entries which help to sanction a breed submitted after October 1st, 2010 will not be considered late.

General

1. Due to health and safety issues, no cooking will be allowed in the barn; food and drink may not be consumed in the animal areas; and exhibitors should wash hands after handling animals.

2. All animals must be dehorned and tattooed or else will be disqualified.

3. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to see that their animals are fed, watered and milked daily for the duration of the Fair. Failure to maintain animals and exhibit to acceptable standards and/or failure to cooperate with Fair Officials will result in premium forfeiture and immediate dismissal from the Fairgrounds.

4. Bedding is not provided. The ground is soft clay, if exhibitors want to put down bedding it should be hay or straw, **no shavings**. There will be an area for soiled bedding.

5. Water in St. Johns County is brackish.

6. Nigerian Dwarf exhibitors may have to bring extra fencing material, slots of pens are too wide.

7. Exhibitors must supply their own show supplies.

8. Exhibitors are recommended to bring their own wheel barrows and rakes. Water hoses will be provided but limited.

9. No dogs allowed in the barn.

10. Only animals being shown at the St. Johns County Fair are permitted on the Fairgrounds.

11. Any person who violates any of the general rules or special rules as posted in this premium list will forfeit all privileges and premiums won.

12. Overnight sleeping will be allowed in the tack pens providing materials are not set up before the barn is closed at 11:00 pm and put away by 8:00 am. There will be keys for the restrooms locked during the night.

13. All tack supplies, etc. must be kept within the tack space (i.e.: chairs, milk stanchions, wheel barrows, etc.) cannot be put into the public aisles/walkways. Area in front of pens must be kept clean.

14. The St. Johns County Fair will provide no feed or hay. There will be hay for sale.

15. Milk will be dumped in the provided milk dump.

16. The costume contest is not mandatory but all ages are encouraged to participate.

Arrival

1. An accredited state inspector will be available to check the unloading of the animals between 10:00 AM – 2:00PM, Friday, October 22, 2010. After animals are checked in by the state inspector, members of the show committee will assign pens.

2. **NO ANIMALS WILL BE UNLOADED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS UNTIL THEY HAVE BEEN INSPECTED BY THE INSPECTOR! NO EXCEPTIONS!**

3. Members of the show committee will check registration papers and classes between 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM.

4. If an animal is leased, the lease agreement/ ADGA confirmation must be available.

5. Substitution animals will be accepted at registration.

6. All livestock must enter the Fairgrounds at the Livestock Entrance off Armstrong Road.

7. All trailers will be parked in a remote location adjacent to the livestock facility.

8. Parking of exhibitor's vehicle in designated areas only. Parking permit will be available by registration.

9. Any animal arriving late due to an emergency must notify the Livestock Office before 2:00 PM at (904) 540-2637.

Judging

1. Exhibitors must be clean and neat, dressed in black or white pants or long skirts and a solid white collar shirt. No shorts allowed. Closed – toed shoes or boots are required. Exhibitors not conforming to dress code will not be allowed to enter the show ring.

2. Breeds will show in the following order. For Junior: Nigerian Dwarf, Alpine, La Mancha, Oberhasli Nubian, Saanen, Toggenburg, and Recorded Grade. For Senior: Nigerian Dwarf, Alpine, La Mancha,, Nubian, AOP, and Recorded Grade.

3. The decision of the judge shall be final and no appeal will be considered except in cases of written protest.

4. Any exhibitor who interferes with the judging will be promptly excluded from competition; if after judging, the premiums awarded will be withheld.

5. All animals must enter the show ring and be evaluated by the judge in order to receive premiums.

Release

1. Goats will be released at conclusion of show, Sunday, October 24, 2010.

2. All pens must be left free of any material. Saturated bedding must also be removed. Water buckets must be dumped outside of the livestock barn. All personal items, trash and other debris must be cleaned from the barn prior to check out. **Optional pen clean-out will be available for a \$5.00 fee.**

3. Milk must be dumped in the provided milk dump.
4. Exhibitors are required to sign-in and sign-out. All exhibitors must have a signed release form in order to leave. Release forms will be issued when pens have been checked and approved for cleanliness. Anyone not signing a release form will forfeit all premium monies won.
